RYE and Beyond

Nikki Fox shared her memories and observations about RYLA and her Rotary Youth Exchange experience in Santa Catarina, Brazil. She stayed with three families and quickly learned enough Portuguese to communicate effectively.

A highly visual PowerPoint emphasized her remarks. To enrich her presentation to the club, she also circulated postcards and other printed material about the extended visit.

Nikki attended a private school during her stay; public schools are "not very good" in Brazil, she commented. She wore a uniform and participated in many school activities. Although school officials initially did not expect her to do any school work, she eventually convinced them to include her in instructional activities as well.

Nikki attended the weekly meetings of the host Rotary Club and a few others. She also volunteered at a local community center, leading singing and other activities and exercises with the elderly.

A highlight of the visit was a 10-day adventure in the Amazon rainforest, traveling mostly by boat. She found this opportunity "amazing." The forest is "surreal."

Nikki became so proficient with Portuguese that, since her return to the USA, she ranked first in a nationwide exam in Portuguese. She acknowledged that her knowledge of Spanish helped immensely, and she now plans to major in Spanish. She is still in contact with her Brazilian families and friends and genuinely treasures the wonderful experience.

She acknowledged that she had some challenge in readjusting when she returned home. However, she now attends the University of Rochester (NY) and will be a sophomore this fall.
