Gumdrops

Founders Amy and Ron Simpson (Carterville) shared a great wealth of information about the Gumdrops program: origins, scope, mission, hopes, future, needs.

The idea began as a young women's mission project that had local impact and importance. The "Gum-" portion of the name stands for "God Use Me." The project began with a dozen children in the Carterville school district who needed support and assistance. Ultimately, the hope is to reach, through the schools, any child needing such assistance in any school district south of Mt. Vernon.

By 2012, the program serves 43 schools in seven counties. estimated at 1400 children. Amy explained that the number of children aided varies all the time as the in-school contacts recognize new needs and as transient families change.

The program is a legitimate 501(c)3 organization with a main source of support from the St. Louis Food Bank. Approximately 40 volunteers meet one or two days per week to fill bags with various foodstuffs, then deliver them to the affiliated schools for private distribution. They now work from a contributed facility in Carterville, but a larger location is needed.

The program has existed in some Jackson County school districts since 2008 (Murphysboro, Giant City), DeSoto (2010), and Elkville and Vergennes (2011). Next in the county is Unity Point.
