Jagan Ailinani, RC-Carbondale Curtis Vaughn (R Osborn)

U of Illinois Extension Service

Sonja Lallemand, an Agriculture & Natural Resources (ANR) Educator for the University of Illinois Extension Service, shared information about the Service, its 100 years of service, its programs, and her background.

She is assigned to Unit 26, serving the counties of Franklin, Jackson, Randolph, Williamson, and Perry. Her time is allocated to regional programs (70%) and statewide activities (30%).

The Extension Service provides education in five broad areas:

- ♦ Healthy society
- ♦ Food security and safety
- ♦ Environmental stewardship
- Sustainable and profitable food production and marketing systems
- Enhancing youth, family and community well-being

She explained in some detail two significant volunteer programs: Master Gardener and Master Naturalist. More than 3400 volunteers are trained as Master Gardeners statewide, including both initial training and annual continuing education. The mission of the Master Naturalist Program is to provide science-based educational opportunities that connect people with nature and help them become engaged environmental stewards.
