TRF: Global Grants

VP **Martha Cropper** provided updated information about the Global Grants program of The Rotary Foundation. In context, she also discussed grant possibilities for the club to consider.

As The Rotary Foundation reorganized the overall grant program last year, several grant were merged to create three categories: District Grants, Global Grants, and Partnership Grants.

Global grants now include three general types of activities: humanitarian projects, scholarships for graduate-level study, and vocational training teams. The last one involves groups of professionals traveling abroad to teach local professionals in other countries or to learn more about their own fields / professions in an international context.

Funding has been restructured. The minimum level of grant funding is \$30,000, of which TRF may provide a minimum of \$15,000 and not more than \$200,000. Clubs and/or districts provide District Designated Funds (100% match by TRF) and/or cash (50% match by TRF).

A grant must address one or more of six designated Areas of Focus: promoting peace; fighting disease; providing clean water; saving mothers and children; supporting education; and growing local economies.

Grant guidelines call for a partnership of Rotary clubs or districts. Sustainability of the intended outcomes is needed for long-term success beyond the grant period. A needs assessment - responding to real community needs - is required as a basis for grant development. Establishing measurable goals is essential. Active involvement of Rotarians and community members is a necessary element.

Cropper outlined her initial thinking and planning for a possible project to support water projects at the schools involved in the "Teach My Kenyan Children" program in which she is involved. Discussion followed.
