"Light Up Rotary"

The 537 district governors, their spouses and partners, and many RI officers witnessed the announcement by 2014-25 RI President Gary C. K. Huang at the International Assembly in San Diego earlier this year.

Huang noted the origins of the theme in a Chinese proverb ascribed to philosopher Confucius. "The Rotary way is the Confucius way. The Rotary way is to light a candle. I light one, you light one, 1.2 million Rotarians light one. Together, we light up the world," said Huang, a member of the Rotary Club of Taipei in Taiwan.

During the five-day training meeting, Huang urged club members to Light Up Rotary in the coming year by hosting a Rotary Day in their community and including local Rotaract and Interact members in their service projects. "How you Light Up Rotary is up to you," Huang added. "You know where you are strong, you know what your community needs, and you know how you can help."

Huang also shared his membership development goals, including the need for more women and young adults. He announced a goal to increase membership to a total of 1.3 million members. He asked Rotarians to invite their spouses, family members, and friends to join Rotary.

International Theater

Professor Segun Ojewuyi shared a travelogue of his first visit to the USA and other multinational trips to explore the nature of theater in varying cultures.

During his first visit to the USA, he was the youngest and the only African - among diverse participants in a multi-city tour sponsored by the US State Department. This provided an informative opportunity to share insights about theater and culture with professionals from many nations and professional perspectives.

Ojewuyi also used the opportunity to explore how art does and does not portray human needs, contrasting the realities of human existence against the commercial gloss often portrayed in modern theater. Where he noted conflicts, he sought solutions - a quest.

During other international tours, he similarly explored such similarities and differences that portrayed certain sharp contrasts. Taken together, these experiences informed his lifelong purpose to use theater to expose the basic humanity of Africa, then other nations and their governments. He frequently noted issues of violence. corruption, and dictatorial national leadership as sharp contrasts to meeting basic human needs.

In his view, the essential human qualities to expose and resolve such contrasts are the following: diligence, integrity, passion and compassion, service to others. and commitment.

He views theater as a primary means of bringing these needs and contrasts to public attention, viewing theater as an answer to social needs, not primarily as entertainment.
