

New Generations: Service Exchanges

Rotary International is beginning to expand the availability of exchange programs to include "service exchanges" for young adults, ages 18 to 25, a suitable option for recent secondary school graduates, young professionals, and Rotaractors.

The new exchange opportunities will be three weeks to six months in duration. They may be oneway or reciprocal visits. Exchanges may be arranged for individuals or groups and can involve homestays, tours, or camps.

The exchanges emphasize humanitarian or vocational service experiences. Thus, they provide opportunities for young people to discover their strengths, use their skills to help others, and enhance their professional backgrounds.

Applicants should be open-minded individuals who have demonstrated leadership in their community. Candidates should also possess qualities such as flexibility and a willingness to try new things that will enable them to fully experience life in another country and become excellent cultural ambassadors. The exchanges are an opportunity to learn about a different culture while fostering goodwill and understanding.

Invisible Pain Project

Mandi Harris related the origin, initial steps, and future directions of the IPP, beginning with her rersonal experience. Husband Justin briefly spoke of his caretaker role, but he actually has a larger role in the project.

Mandi summarized her ongoing personal experience with melanoma (cancer) and her recognition that many young adults experience unseen health challenges. During the odyssey, she has met persons living with multiple sclerosis, Crohn's disease, and lupus, among other disorders, ailments, and diseases.

As she met others, she realized that her own experience is really a project (1) to educate people across the region and (2) to assist and support others with similar needs, including the caregivers. She expects the project will evolve into an organization to address physical, emotional, and financial needs.

The IPP has grown out of the Strong Survivors program conducted by the Kinesiology faculty at SIUC. This brings attention to nutrition and exercise as elements of managing and healing from diverse experiences with invisible pain. SIH is a partner. Mandi works at St. Joseph hospital (Murphysboro) and the Center for Medical Arts (Carbondale).

One visible outcome will be a "Super Survivors" calendar, now a work in progress. Harris started with a 'superhero' concept that grew into a calendar to spotlight "elegant, fierce survivors" ... publication date pending.
