Co-Op Inc.

Courtney Smith, presented an inside view of the Co-Op following a brief personal profile. She graduated from SIUC in 1995 with a BFA degree in printmaking, then worked for a decade at Attitude Designs and began farming as well. Last year, she began work at the Co-Op as Outreach Services Coordinator because its principles matched her values.

Through a highly visually appealing PowerPoint, she presented the products and services of the Co-Op: bakery, beverages, dry and liquid bulk supplies, meats, body care, and non-GMO products, among others.

Smith also contrasted the location and products of the previous location at Town Square versus the expansion / relocation in 2006 to Murdale Shopping Center. She briefly touched on the new practice of open book management, evident in the weekly sharing session.

Among upcoming events and activities are a 5K run / walk (12th year!), grilling at the Co-Op in conjunction with Sunset Concerts at Turley Park, and a Farm Crawl in September.
