Peace Corps Partnership

To promote global development and volunteer service, **Rotary International** and the **Peace Corps** have agreed to a one-year pilot program in the Philippines, Thailand, and Togo. Through the agreement, Rotary clubs and Peace Corps volunteers share their resources and knowledge to enhance the impact of development projects in these three countries.

Peace Corps Acting Director **Carrie Hessler-Radelet** and RI General Secretary **John Hewko** signed the letter of collaboration on 5 May. Both organizations are committed to improving lives and building stronger communities by addressing root causes of violence and conflict, such as poverty, illiteracy, disease, and lack of access to clean water and sanitation.

Autism Spectrum Disorders

Valerie Boyer, director of the SIUC Center for Autism Spectrum Disorders (ASD), shared a closer view of the origins, services, and practices of the Center. She is an Assistant Professor in Communication Disorders and Science.

She summarized autism as a "deficit in social communication," commonly marked with ritual behaviors, regimentation, and heightened special interests. The number of persons with ASD is increasing, partially from increased awareness, improved diagnosis, and the regular aging of those identified in previous years.

The Center is primarily involved in service, training, and some research. The service component includes diagnostic services, intensive therapy, consultation with school districts, and counseling for families. Therapy includes three hours per week for 15-16 families.

The training of new/future professionals is an evolving program, including both instruction and hands-on involvement in the Center's service programs. Ongoing research enhances both the service and the training elements. Diagnosis begins with an initial screening (often by phone) and a level two team consultation based on extensive observation.

The Center is funded by a state grant, which supports three full-time staff, one speech pathologist, and a licensed counselor.
