# Visiting Rotarians & Guests

### **SIUC Honors Program**

Director **Lori Merrill-Fink** shared the recent history, growth, and nature of SIUC's fastest-growing program.

Merrill-Fink was asked to head the Honors Program in 2007 and realized soon that refocusing was desirable. Some 1200 students were in the program at that time, but only 200+ were actively involved. This provided a superb opportunity to explore new approaches and, for her, to engage a new skill set.

In seven years, the number of honors courses has increased by 50+%. Now, there are two tracks. For an honors diploma, a student must complete seven courses and an honors thesis; for an honors certificate, five courses, no thesis needed.

With the new requirements, the number of students in the program dropped off notably before increasing again on the new tracks. Currently: 850 approx.

The Honors Program is now the fastest-growing program at SIUC. The emphasis is value-added learning.

Among incentives and values are early registration for courses term by term and even Honors housing for a renewed perspective on a thriving academic "community."

Recently, a select group of students engaged in a period of study at Oxford University, including one-on-one mentoring with an Oxford don - a unique experience.

Merrill-Fink reported that she is not new to Rotary. Her grandfather and father were both club presidents. She enjoyed a Rotary Youth Exchange visit, and her own family members have had similar international travel opportunities.
