Continuing the Foundation Month theme, VP Martha Cropper shared updated information about the District Simplified Grants (DSGs, now District Grants) program and our involvement over time. Then, she presented an overview of polio and Rotary International's PolioPlus and polio eradication efforts since the 1980s.

In an earlier form, the club earned (1998) a joint Matching Grant from TRF, along with the RC-Carbondale and the new RC-Carterville Area, to provide educational materials to three schools for young women in Bangladesh.

More recently, DSGs included, in part, such projects as new outdoor grills at the Boy Scout camp, improvements at the Boys & Girls Club of Carbondale, an outside basketball goal at the Life Community Center of Carbondale Park District, and, this year, tree planting in cooperation with Keep Carbondale Beautiful.

Next, VP Martha provided a view of polio we often do not hear: types, symptoms, related medical history, all as context for Rotary International's extended effort to eradicate polio worldwide. She reported the most recent status, noting efforts are now focused on eradicating the final one percent of cases.
