Kathryn Mutchnick - GSE Team Member

GSE: Brazil

Republica Federativa do Brasil ... Independence: 7 September 1822 (from Portugal) ... 26 states and 1 federal district ... Legislative: Federal Senate (81 members, eight-year terms) and Chamber of Deputies (513 seats, four-year terms) Economy: agricultural, mining, manufacturing, and service sectors ... Brazil's economy outweighs that of all other South American countries ... eighth largest gross domestic product in the world ... Ethnic groups: white (53.7%), mulatto (38.5%), black (6.2%), other (incl. Japanese, Arab, Amerindian - 0.9%), unspecified (0.7%) ... Religions: Roman Catholic (nominal) 73.6%, Protestant 15.4%, Spiritualist 1.3%, Bantu/Voodoo 0.3%, other 1.8%, unspecified 0.2%, none 7.4% Languages: Portuguese (official); Spanish (border areas and schools), German, Italian, Japanese, English, and a large number of minor Amerindian languages ... Population: 201 million ... urban population: 87% of total ... Literacy (definition: age 15 and over can read and write) 90.4%.

GSE Team members Kathyrn Mutchnick, Aur Beck, and Jack Wides shared wide-ranging comments on their visit to the state of Espirito Santo, capital: Vitorio/Victoria. This state is 70% ethnic Italian. The team visited many towns in the mountains.

Kathryn said she found the people to be very open and welcoming. The schools are highly book-centered, taught in English. She fondly recalls the coffee and the chocolate.

Aur noted that the team visited many Rotary clubs in evening meetings, typically including the families. Meetings started at 7 p.m., but dinner was served at the end of the meeting, about 9 p.m.

The team's PowerPoint presentation featured their live radio session, BBQ, granite quarries, a jeans factory, a weekend visit to Rio, coffee plantations, steel mill visit, country clubs, newspaper visits, manufacturing with exotic woods, agrotourism, cultural nights, and many other memorable occasions.
