Gum Drops

NEWS! GUM Drops is extending its services to Carbondale through the Boys & Girls Club.

Gum Drops is a non-for-profit organization that began in January 2008, feeding more than 1,400 at-risk children every week of the school year.

Total meals provided in subsequent years reached a total of 41,041 students in 2013. Today they deliver more than 1,400+ packages weekly in seven or more counties of Southern Illinois: 14 different school districts. 43 schools – and growing!

Items typically needed include Chef Boyardee, fruit cups. Ramen noodles, pudding packs, oatmeal, cheese and crackers, applesauce cups, Easy Mac bowls, and popcorn.

Volunteers are needed Tuesday (10 a.m. and 6:30 p.m.) and Wednesday (6:30 pm) to prepare the weekly distribution.

SIC: Cancer Institute & Center

Director **Jennifer Badiu** shared insights and valuable information about the Institute and its relationships, then a progress report on the nature and construction of the new Center in Carterville.

The Institute, established in 2010, was developed to provide the full spectrum of cancer services within the region, rather than patients having to travel to other facilities, including "prevention, screening, early detection, diagnosis, treatment and support during survivorship, or if necessary, end-of-life care or bereavement."

More recently, the Institute has emphasized prospective treatment planning, supported by team-based planning and dedicated research assistance.

Through academic affiliation, the Institute also collaborates with the Simmons Cancer Institute at the SIU School of Medicine and participates in the BJC Collaboration consortium. Among other benefits, these relationships provide grant opportunities and video conferencing for education and second-opinion consulting.

The Cancer Center under construction is approximately 90% - 95% complete, with the expectation of SIH having access this fall and a ribbon-cutting ceremony in February 2015.

The Cancer Center, a 43,500-square-foot facility, has an estimated economic impact of \$24.5 million: \$15.5 million for construction, \$2.2 million for the land site, and some 300 construction jobs.

The Center will have 50-60 employees in full operation. The Center will provide comprehensive treatment and intervention services – outpatient basis only. Considerable attention has been given to "value streams" in the design and operation of the new facility.

The attendant campaign has a \$10 million goal, with approximately \$5 million completed.
