Rotary International has a long history of observing February as World Understanding Month. This is partially because the anniversary of the founding of Rotary is 23 February and partially because the time brings focus to the cultural diversity of Rotary and its many projects, programs, and global initiatives over the years.

“As we enter World Understanding Month, I ask all of you to remember that every project has a twofold purpose: meeting its practical objective and building goodwill and friendship,” wrote RI President Wilf Wilkinson for this month’s *Rotarian* magazine.

Perhaps the most important underpinning of Rotary and this monthly designation is the belief that world peace can only be achieved through understanding, not violence. Wilkinson emphasizes that Rotary works to build such

ADOLESCENT HEALTH CENTER

Joe Baker provided an update on the local and area activities of Shawnee Health Service, the parent organization. Baker is Clinic Manager for the Adolescent Health Center, Terrier Care (at CCHS), and Marion Unit #2 Wellness Center (at MHS).

The Adolescent Health Center provides services for children, teens, and young adults, including medical, dental, and social services. At the high schools, medical and dental services are available for students, faculty, and staff.

The parent organization, Shawnee Health Service, is the umbrella for a number of other programs and facilities, including the Carterville Family Practice Center, Illinois Centre Behavioral Health, Migrant Health Program (at Murphysboro Health Center), Shawnee Women's Health and Family Medicine, Southern Illinois Respiratory Disease Clinics (Herrin and Carbondale), and Murphysboro Health Center.

SHS is a Federally Qualified Health Center (FQHC). Such centers are serve high-risk and vulnerable populations, with outreach, patient education, and support services. Federal grants are the primary funding sources; patients are also charged on a sliding fee scale. SHS is a 501 (c) (3) tax-exempt not-for-profit organization, established in 1971 and based in Carterville.
