About Belize

An independent state in Central America; 8,867 square miles. Bounded on the north by Mexico, on the west and south by Guatemala, on the east by the Caribbean Sea. Capitol: Belmopan. Largest city/main port: Belize City (capitol until 1970); on Belize River at the Caribbean.

Parliamentary democracy. Bicameral legislature: senate and national assembly. A prime minister is head of the government. Elizabeth II is the titular head of state, represented by a governor-general.

Subtropical climate. Largely heavily forested; some regions of savannas and barren pine ridges.

The majority of people are of mestizo, African, or Mayan descent. English is the official language; Spanish is widely spoken. About two-thirds of the population is Roman Catholic, one-third Protestant.

Only a small portion of the land is cultivated, but agriculture is about 75% of Belizean exports: sugar cane, citrus fruits, and fish. Clothing and woods are also important products. Tourism and construction are increasingly important.

Business Meeting

Minutes. Approved as presented.

Treasury. Year-to-date through June 1: Total income-\$14,661; total expenses-\$11,277. Balance in checking: \$3766. Accts receivable (Dues): \$375. Liabilities (scholarship)-\$2,500. Equity-\$1,641.

2010-11 Budget. PE **Rich Sarao** and Treasurer **Shane Carsrud** presented the proposed budget for approval, as required in June by the bylaws. Anticipated income/expenses: \$13,700/\$13,700. Basis: 33 paying members. Adds a dictionary project and a president's fund. Anticipated charitable expenses: Boys & Girls Club: \$800; Women's Center: \$350; CCHS scholarships: \$2,250 (3@\$750); Belize program: \$350. Approved by vote of the membership.

Memorials Policy. The committee of **Marcia Sinnott, Fran Becque, Jim Romano, and George Waring** presented the proposed policy. Brief discussion. Approved by vote of the membership.

Art/Crafts/Yard Sale. Service Projects Chairman **Terry Mathias** distributed the Seller Information Sheet and the Seller Registration form for club members' information. He asked club members to help with six immediate action needs, noting that other items will be brought forth in the coming weeks.
